I. Objectives

It is to advocate our traditional culture, promote dragon boat folk sports, and foster international exchange and friendship.

II. Guiding Authority: Ministry of Sports

III. Organizer: Taipei City Government

IV. Manager: Department of Sports, Taipei City Government

V. Co-Organizer:

Taipei Municipal Athletics Federation, Department of Information and Tourism, Department of Transportation, Taipei City Fire Department, Taipei City Police Department, Department of Health, Department of Environmental Protection, Department of Personnel, Department of Government Ethics, Hydraulic Engineering Office and Parks & Street Lights Office of Public Works Department, Taipei City Public Transportation Office, Taipei City Parking Management and Development Office, Taipei Bei An Junior High School, Taipei Water Department, and The Red Cross Society

VI. Date: From June 19, 2026 (Friday) to June 21, 2026 (Sunday)

VII. Venue:

Yingfeng Dock, Dajia Section River Way, Keelung River (under Dazhi Bridge, East-West bound 500-meter waterway), Taipei City.

VIII. Competition Categories and Divisions

1. Standard Dragon Boat:

(1) Number of teams: The number of teams for each category are listed as follows:

(a) Men's Division (maximum of 20 teams)

(b) Women's Division (maximum of 12 teams)

(c) Mixed Division (maximum of 48 teams)

Females are allowed to register for the Men's division.

(2) The cap number for each category includes the reserved winning teams in 2025. Teams organized by Embassies and overseas units in Taiwan and the local and foreign teams invited by the Organizer will not be included in the number of each category.

(3) The winning teams from the previous year -2025 Championships

(listed in Appendix 1) are in reserved places. The reserved teams should register under the same name for the same category of competition as the previous year and follow all registration requirements and deadline.

2. Small Dragon Boat

(1) Number of teams:

(a) The number of teams for each division are listed as follows:

(i) Men's Division (maximum of 20 teams)

(ii) Women's Division (maximum of 20 teams)

(iii) Mixed Division (maximum of 48 teams)

Females are allowed to register for the Men's division.

(b) The cap number for each category includes the reserved winning teams in 2025. Teams organized by Embassies and overseas units in Taiwan and the local and foreign teams invited by the Organizer will not be included in the number of each category.

(c) The winning teams from the previous year -2025 Championships (listed in Appendix 1) are in reserved places. The reserved teams should register under the same name for the same category of competition as the previous year and follow all registration requirements and deadline.

(2) Junior Division (Maximum of 12 teams):

(a) Mixed teams (with no more than 6 male paddlers in each team) Students from public or private high schools (vocational schools) may organize teams to enter. Crew members of each team are not limited to one school.

(b) The captain must be over 20 years of age.

(c) A copy of student ID from the school for each crew members is required for registration.

(d) There is no reserved team and the registration/entry fee is waived, for this division to promote participation.

(3) Masters Division:

(a) The entry fee is waived for this division to promote participation.

(b) Participants must be over 50 years of age (born before June 19th, 1976).

- (c) Divisions for this category:
 - (i) Mixed division: 36 teams maximum. There is no gender ratio restriction for this division.
 - (ii) Woman's Division: 12 teams maximum.
 - (d) The winning teams from the previous year (listed in Appendix 1) are in reserved places. The reserved teams should register under the same name for the same category of competition as the previous year and follow all registration requirements and deadlines.
3. The organizer reserves the right to change maximum number of teams for each category based on number of teams registered. In principle, the total number of teams for the Championships will not exceed 228 teams. (See Appendix 2 for details) The number does not include invitational teams.
 4. The Organizer reserves the right to cancel or adopt other competition arrangement with less than 5 teams registered for the category or division. The registration fees will be refunded for canceled category or divisions. No refund will be provided for any other conditions.

IX. Registration

1. Online Registration: Registration is accepted on the official website (dragonboat.taipei) of the 2026 Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships (hereinafter referred to as the dragon boat website).
2. Online registration opens at 10:00 AM on March 23, 2026 (Monday) and closes at 23:00 on March 27, 2026 (Friday).
3. Post in registration document:
 - (1) It is advised to check if all information provided is correct before submitting the entry online. After completing online registration, have the following documents printed out and signed (forms not downloaded from the registration system will not be accepted). And send them to the designated address before the following dates with registered mail. Failed to do so or late submission will be deemed as invalid registration.
 - (a) deadlines for posting registration documents
 - (i) Accepted active teams (registered teams): 6:00 PM of March 30, 2026 (Monday) (determined by the postmark date)

- (ii) Waitlisted teams being notified to confirmed active teams (registered teams): 6:00PM of April 7, 2026 (Tuesday) (determined by the postmark date)
- (2) Forms downloaded from sources other than the registration system will not be accepted.
- (3) No personal delivery of registration document will be accepted.
- 4. Registration Fee
 - (1) Payment via paper form: Within the registration period, print out the payment slip and pay at Taipei Fubon Bank counters, designated convenience stores, or via ATM. After payment, affix the receipt on the registration documents.
 - (2) EasyWallet Payment: Upload the transaction record to the team's registered account within the registration period.
 - (3) Failure to make timely payment will result in forfeiture of the confirmed spot. Late payments will not be considered, and the vacated spot will be allocated to a waitlisted team in the same category/division."
 - (4) The registration fee is 3,000 TWD for each team registered for Standard Dragon Boat Championships and Small Dragon Boat Championships. The registration fee is waived for Invitation teams and teams registered for Junior Division or Master Division.
 - (5) The registration fee receipt can be downloaded from the official dragon boat website from 10:00 AM of April 10, 2026 to 23:59 of June 30, 2026.
 - (6) The registration fee will not be refunded regardless of whether the team participated in the competition or not. Teams that fail to pick up their accreditation within the time announced by the Organizer will be disqualified from the competition and the registration fee will not be refunded. Except when the competition is suspended due to the announcement of the Organizer, the Organizer will refund the registration fee in full to the team account (the domestic bank account provided in the registration system to receive the subsidy when registering).
- 5. Registration Instructions
 - (1) Team name: The Mandarin team name or the Mandarin-English mixed team name shall not exceed 8 characters (units).

(2) Crew member:

(a) Team members:

- (i) It refers to the "paddler" or "steersperson". Participants must choose one of the two identities to register. Only those registered as team members are allowed to board the boat for competition.
- (ii) Drummers should be registered as "paddlers."
- (iii) The paddlers of any team cannot register as "paddler(s)" nor "steersperson" for other teams.**
- (iv) Those who register as "paddler" can serve as the steersperson of the registered team in the race.
- (v) The registered steersperson can only steer the boat. He/She CAN NOT compete as the paddler nor the drummer.**
- (vi) The steersperson is not limited to register as "steersperson" to one team. He/ She can register as steersperson for other teams.
- (vii) Each team can only register one steersperson.**
- (viii) The male steersperson can be registered for the women's team as the steersperson.
- (ix) Those serving as the organizer's public steersperson cannot concurrently serve as any team's paddler nor steersperson.
- (x) Must be at least 15 years of age (born before June 19, 2011). Members under the age of 18 need to submit the "Letter of Consent from Guardian for Underage Participants" (including relevant supporting documents, see Appendix 7 for more details).

(b) Team Officials:

- (i) It refers to the "team leader", "coach" and "manager". Team officials must choose only one of the three identities to register. The only exception is for teams registered for the Junior Division. Junior Division teams do not need to register any team officials, but still need to provide the window of contact for their teams.
- (ii) "Team Officials" are not allowed to board the boat for the competition. If they want to board the boat for the

competition, they must register additionally as a "crew member". Only the Junior Division team officials can register additionally as a "steersperson".

(iii) Those who are registered as "team officials" and additionally registered as "steersperson" can register as another team's "steersperson" to assist other teams to steer the boat.

(3) Personal information: Names, gender, ID numbers (those who are with a foreign passport need to provide their passport numbers or Alien Permanent Resident Certificate (ARC) number), date of birth (in AD format/ Gregorian calendar), contact phone number, email, and mailing address along with recent photo of officials and crew members.

Your photo must be (in jpg format):

- * Clear and in focus
- * Taken within one month and in color
- * **Facial features should be clearly visible and not obscured and face front to facilitate identification**
- * At least 531 pixels X 354 pixels (height X width) in resolution.
- * The file size is limited to 4MB.
- * Face front with all features revealed and face covering 70% - 80% of the photo.
- * The head or hair should not reach the frame of the photo, however, female with hair length touching the lower frame of the photo is acceptable.

(4) register to bring its own equipment:

(a) Life jackets: Please indicate whether the team has their own life jackets when registering. For teams that wish to bring their own life jackets, need to make sure they meet the specifications regulated in Appendix 3 and must be fully aware of and abide by the content of Acknowledgement of Risk/Responsibility and Liability Waiver for Teams with Personal Life Jackets (Appendix 4).

(b) Paddles: Please specify the number of personal paddles in the registration system when registering. The personal paddles must

- meet the specification and regulations of IDBF (Appendix 5).
- (5) Team introduction: It is for the announcement during competition which includes description of team characteristics, achievements over the years, promotion of the unit or organization, etc. It is limited to 200 words.
 - (6) Consent of Participation (The Organizer will not accept team registration if it is not signed by all participants.):
 - (a) Consent for Release of Personal Information (Appendix 6).
 - (b) Letter of Consent from Legal Representative (Guardian) for Underage Participants (including relevant supporting documents, as shown in Appendix 7).
 - (c) Team Grant Agreement and a copy of the account bankbook (Appendix 8).
 - (7) For the teams registered for small size dragon boat division, they can apply for a public steersperson by ticking the corresponding box in the registration system.
6. Steersperson Training Workshop Registration: Teams accepted may each send one of their team members to participate in the workshop. There are two sessions in total, each session admits 70 people, selected in order of application until full.
- (1) When teams register online, they may submit a first-nominated and a second-nominated team member. If the first-nominated member cannot attend for any reason, the second-nominated member may take their place. If the replacement is needed, please notify the organizers by April 20th, 2026.
 - (2) The workshop dates are as follows. Training hours are from 8:00 AM to 4:30 PM each day.
 - (a) First session (three days): May 2, 2026 (Saturday), May 3, 2026 (Sunday), May 9th, 2026 (Saturday).
 - (b) Second session (three days): May 10, 2026 (Sunday), May 16, 2026 (Saturday), May 17, 2026 (Sunday).

- 8. **No changes to registration information will be accepted for this Championships.** Teams are required to fill out accurate information and upload correct photos when registering online. If incorrect information is found upon review, teams will be notified to correct the information. If correction is not made within the specified time frame, the team will be directly disqualified from the competition.
- 9. Relevant information notifications will mainly be sent to the team contact person by e-mail. Teams are responsible for confirming the accuracy of their email address and checking their inbox.

X. Number of Team Crew and Conditions

- 1. For Standard Dragon Boat Championships
 - (1) The number of team members must not exceed the maximum of 35 persons, including up to 3 team officials (one captain/team leader, one coach, one manager) and up to 32 team crews (including the paddlers, a steersperson, and a drummer).
 - (2) Any team wishes to participate is required to recruit its own steersperson/coxswain. The organizer will not provide public steersperson.
- 2. For Small Dragon Boat Championships
 - (1) The number of team members must not exceed the maximum of 25 persons, including up to 3 team officials (one captain/team leader, one coach, one manager) and up to 22 team crews (including the paddlers, the steersperson, and the drummer).
 - (2) Teams may apply for the organizer's public steersperson based on prior request. The public steersperson can't be held responsible for successfully finishing the race. Thorough consideration is advised for each team for it is responsible for its decision of whether to request a public steersperson's assistance.
- 3. It is recommended that each team registers the full number of team members to ensure enough number of participants when one of the athletes is not able to participate due to unforeseen reasons.
- 4. Understanding this event can be considered as a strenuous sport, all

registered team crews must possess knowledge of water safety and swimming ability as well as having passed a health examination to participate. Assess and continually monitor one's personal fitness level and health condition to make sure the individual is well enough for competitive sports before any competitions or trainings. Each team's officials are responsible for insuring that all team members comply with this regulation.

5. For the "steersperson" registered for multiple teams, in the case of the concurrent team schedule conflicts, the Organizer is not obliged to change the schedule or delay the roll call time.

XI. Race Format

The Organizer will determine the race format applied based on the number of teams registered.

XII. Meetings

1. Team Draw

The team draw meeting will be held at the 3rd floor, Audio Visual Room of Department of Sports, Taipei City Government at 14:00 on May 6, 2026 (Wednesday). All teams must send a representative to attend. No further notice will be given. If a team fails to send a representative for the team draw, the administration office of the event organizer has the right to draw for the team. And the team must accept the drawing result without reservation.

2. Technical Meeting

Technical Meeting will be held at the 3rd floor, Audio Visual Room of Department of Sports, Taipei City Government at 14:00 on June 13, 2026 (Saturday). The Team Accreditation cards will be distributed at the Technical Meeting. No further notice will be given. The teams that are not able to attend the Technical meeting need to pick up their accreditation cards between 18:00-20:00 of June 15, 2026 (Monday) or between 9:00-18:00 of June 18, 2026 (Thursday) at 1F of Department of Sports, Taipei City Government. **Other pick-up time will not be available.**

XIII. Race Gears and Equipment

1. The Organizer will provide all necessary equipment for the competition such as the boat, rudder, drum, and drumstick. (Other training aids such as the whistles, loudspeakers are not allowed to be used in the event.) The

Organizer reserves the right to make changes to the equipment in case of schedule changes or for any other reason.

2. Each team can bring their own life jackets or wear the life jackets provided by the Organizer. Since dragon boat racing is a team sport, life jackets are regarded as part of the team uniforms. All teams must wear life jackets of the same color. The styles of personal life jackets are mainly zipper or buckle. There is no restriction on color and the brand of the life jacket used. Buoyancy suits, belt-type/waist band type, inflatable, and pneumatic life jackets are prohibited. More details can be found in Appendix 3.
3. The personal life jackets will be inspected by the Organizer. If they do not meet the requirements listed in Appendix 3, the team will be prohibited from using their own lifejackets. And the team is required to wear the life jackets provided by the Organizer.
4. The organizer provides red life jackets. If the team's self-provided life jackets are insufficient in number during the inspection, the team is required to wear the life jackets provided by the organizer uniformly to compete.
5. Participants can prepare their own paddles that meet the specifications of International Dragon Boat Federation (IDBF) standard (see Appendix 5) for the competition. If they do not meet the specifications, please use the paddles provided by the Organizer. There is no restriction for the whole team to use the same style of paddles. All personal racing paddles (even IDBF approved paddles) need to be sent to the Organizer for inspection prior to the race. If the whole team uses the same style and model of paddles, all personal paddles need to be brought to the “paddle inspection area” for random inspection. The Organizer will affix the organizer approved label on the shaft of the approved paddles after the inspection. Any personal paddle that fails to pass the inspection CANNOT be used for the competition.
6. Any team that intends to use their personal paddles, must deliver all their paddles to the “Inspection Area” for verification at least 30 minutes before the roll call of the team or within the time specified by the Organizer. The Organizer will still apply random inspections after the inspection. If found in random inspection, say, the length of the paddle does not meet the standards set out by IDBF, the team will be directly

disqualified for the competition and the participation subsidy will be canceled.

7. Participating teams that wish to bring their own life jackets and paddles but are uncertain of the specification, can bring the life jackets and paddles to the Draw Meeting or the Technical Meeting. The competition referee team on site will assist in confirming whether they meet the requirements.

XIV. Training Sign-up

1. Pre-Match Training Practice

- (1) Registered teams are eligible to sign up for training sessions prior to the Championships via the Dragon Boat Event website. Training practice operates on an online reservation system; onsite sign up is not available. Further details can be found in Appendix 10 (Safety Guidelines) and Appendix 11 (Guideline for Pre-match Practice Sign-up).
- (2) Pre-Match Training Practice is only open for the teams (coach and crew members) registered for this year's Championships.
- (3) Please make sure to bring a photo ID. For local athletes, Personal Identification card is required for scanning on site. For foreign athletes, the passport or ROC (Taiwan) Resident Certificate is required. The ID provided on site will be used for identification. Each team must follow all the rules and regulations set forth by the event organizer during training practice (Safety Guidelines and Pre-Match Practice Guidelines).
- (4) Personal life jackets and/or personal paddles may be used in Pre-match training practice.

2. Simulation Pool

Please find the details for the rules and regulations of simulation pool and practice sign-up in Appendix 13 and Appendix 14.

XV. Rules & Regulations

1. Any small dragon boat team that needs a race-sponsored public steersperson/coxswain, should make such request in the registration. The assignment of the sponsored steersperson/coxswain is arranged by the Organizer. Once the assignment is made, no changes will be applied, and no objection will be accepted.
2. Crew members of each team must bring his or her own accreditation card

AND personal ID (For local athletes, one of the followings is acceptable: ID, National Health Insurance Card, or Drivers' License. For foreign athletes, the passport or ROC (Taiwan) Resident Certificate is required. For Junior Division athletes, the school ID is required.) to the Roll-call area at least 30 minutes prior to the race. Fail to do so will result in suspension of the race.

3. For Standard Dragon Boat racing, the team must consist of 20 members with 18 paddlers, a steersperson/coxswain, and a drummer. For Small Dragon Boat racing, the team must consist of 12 members with 10 paddlers, a steersperson/coxswain, and a drummer. Any team with smaller number of crew will be disqualified. The number of crew member must be met at the rollcall before boarding the boat for competition.
4. For the Mixed Division Competition, the number of male paddlers for any team in a Standard Dragon Boat match may not exceed 10 persons. For the Mixed Division and Junior Division of Small Dragon Boat Championships, the number of male paddlers may not exceed 6 persons. The ratio of male and female paddlers for Mixed division of Master Category is subject to each team and not bound by the abovementioned numbers.
5. For both Standard Dragon Boat race and Small Dragon Boat race, the result for each race is determined by the sequence in which any part of the boats (hull) passing the finish line in a single run.
6. **When the race is completed, all teams of the same heat should row the boats back by going straight for 15 meters (passing the ball float) then turning the boat to the left and heading back along the riverbank (close to the stage area) to the pier.**
7. Every team must follow the match schedule posted by the Organizer (Event Handbook). The Organizer reserves the right to make any necessary changes. Any changes will be announced by the Race Officials though public announcement.
8. Every participant in the boat is required to wear a life jacket the whole-time during the race from start to finish. The drummer should remain at the front of the boat (between the head/bow of the boat and the first pair of paddlers).

* Note: During the race is defined: from putting on the life jacket on shore, go to the pier and board the boat, starting at the launching point

to crossing the finish line, returning to the pier, leaving the boat and ascending to the pier, until coming ashore and returning the life jacket.

9. The race starting procedure is as follows: As the dragon boats are in place, the race staff will call "Are you ready?" "Attention!" (At this time, the paddle blades must not go into the water and no paddling is allowed) and proceed to go as the start signal is fired by the race official.
- 10. Violation of the following (1) to (10) will result in disqualification of the race and cancellation of the specific competition grant. Violation of (11) to (13) will result in disqualification of the Championships and ALL the competition grant.**
 - (1) The number of crew members on boat is not followed.**
 - (2) The steersperson acts as the paddler during the race.**
 - (3) Any team member who fails to properly wear a life jacket any time of the duration of the race.**
 - (4) Any team uses the necessary equipment for the competition that's not provided by the Organizer such as the boat, rudder, drum and drumstick. (or use other training aids such as whistles, sound amplification device, etc.)**
 - (5) The team does not stay in its designated lane, including**
 - (a) the boat deviates its direction partially or entirely and impact other boats or colliding with or capsizing another boat. If any of the violations occur, the violated team is required to return to the starting pier immediately.**
 - (b) If a boat deviates from its course or spins/circles in place after departure, thereby affecting the progress of the race, the Referee Committee shall immediately disqualify the team from the competition. Furthermore, they will tow the boat to exit the course and return to the launching dock.**
 - (6) No team shall start paddling or have the paddle blades in water before the start signal is fired nor put the paddle(s) against the pier. Violation will be deemed foul start. The team will be penalized upon the second violation of this rule.**
 - (7) All paddlers must adopt a seated paddling position on the boat in the designated seats of the boat from the start to finish of the race. (Only the drummer or the steersperson is not bound by sitting on the boat.) Any violation will result in penalty.**

- (8) For all divisions, the Steerspersons are not allowed to paddle or assist in paddling during the race. (Assisted paddling refers to steering toward the end of the boat anytime from the start of the race to the end of the race.)**
 - (9) Any equipment or crew member falls into the water due to fault any time during the race.**
 - (10) The inspected personal paddle later being found that the length of the paddles being adjusted which did not meet the standards stipulated by IDBF without authorization.**
 - (11) Any team deliberately or by fault to fully stop paddling, blocking, or keep the helm off water and unable to control the boat which causes collision or other incidents during the race.**
 - (12) Any team that misses a race, regardless of the reason, including the case of forfeiting a race or ruled suspension by the Organizer.**
 - (13) Any team or crew member or officials who does not accept the judges' decisions and disturbs or disrupts the order of the event or acts in unsportsmanlike conduct, or acts in any other manner deemed as unsuitable by the Referee Committee. (For example: Crew member intentionally falling/jumping into the water; deliberately dropping equipment or damaging dragon boat equipment, etc.)**
- 11. Teams that are not able to complete the race due to factors beyond their control (such as being affected by other team's fouls), the Organizer will not accept appeals but WILL grant the race participation subsidy.**

XVI. Awards

- Trophies, medals, and certificate:

For all Divisions, the champion will be awarded a trophy. The top three teams will each be awarded a medal. The top six teams will each be awarded a certificate (when 5 teams participate, only the top three teams will receive awards; when 6-9 teams participate, only the top four teams will receive awards; when 10 or more teams participate, the top five teams will receive awards. When 20 or more teams participate, the top six teams will receive awards.) Please find the table below for detail.

3. Grant Subsidy: Subsidy will be issued to the teams that satisfy the followings:

- (1) Submitting the subsidy receipt: “Receipt of Grant” can be downloaded upon completion of the competition at the event website (from 10:00 AM of June 29, 2026 (Monday) to July 3, 2026 (Friday)). The amount of subsidy will be issued based on each team’s participation and the amount will be transferred to the designated account. The designated account holder of the grant subsidy needs to send (or deliver) the filled and signed Team Grant Agreement form to the Department of Sports by July 3, 2026. Late submission will not be accepted.
- (2) Follow the rules and regulations set out by the Organizing and attend the opening ceremony in proper attire. Subsidy will be revoked if there are less than 10 attending members for the standard dragon boat team or less than 6 members for small dragon boat team for the Opening Ceremony. When all members are in attendance, the organizer assigned team sign-bearers will verify the number of attendees and sign in for the team. It is encouraged but not mandatory for teams to participate in the Closing Ceremony except all awarded winning teams are required to participate in the Closing Ceremony.
- (3) Every team shall follow the regulations, complete all the races, and attend the Opening or Closing ceremony. Subsidy will be revoked for any violation of the regulations or forfeiting the match.
- (4) Teams that meet the above-mentioned requirements will be granted a participation subsidies as follows:

Subsidy	NT\$5,000 for every race completed until reaching maximum NT\$20,000 for each team. A total of NT\$3,000 (not accumulated by heats) subsidy is granted once public steersperson is administered.	NT\$5,000 for every race completed until reaching maximum NT\$20,000 for each team.

- (5) For the encouragement of participation, NT\$20,000 subsidy will be provided for teams of the Junior divisions regardless of self-provided steersperson or organizer sponsored (requested) steersperson is administered.
- (6) If the subsidy/grant account holder is a foreigner, please provide a copy of the front/back of the Residence Certificate. If the stay in Taiwan is less than 183 days, 6% of the subsidy amount will be withheld.

XVII. Disputes/Appeals

1. Any disputes relating to the qualification of team members should be brought up by the registered officials or the contact person with signed written appeal at the time of assembly at the Roll-Call Area and CANNOT be disputed once the race started. If the disputes/appeals regarding the competition arise, and no specific provision exists, the referee's decision shall be final and binding.
2. Other disputes regarding the competition must be reported to the Chief Referee on the spot orally and followed by a written appeal (Appendix 9) of the dispute. The written appeal of the dispute needs to be signed by

either registered team officials or the contact person with a deposit of NT\$5,000 to the Organizer within 30 minutes after the race is completed. Once the dispute is sustained, the deposit will be returned. However, if the Referee Committee decides that the dispute is not sustained, the deposit will NOT be refunded.

3. Upon receiving a written appeal, the Organizer will convene a meeting on the same day with the Referee Committee to discuss the dispute and confirm whether it is sustained or not. The Committee's decision in the meeting should be final and binding.
4. For any party dissatisfied with the Organizer's decision or who arbitrarily disseminates false statements or remarks, if , after the Organizer formally discusses and rules on the matters, the competition eligibility and result may be revoked.

XVIII. Addenda

1. Any team that does not follow the rules and regulations set out by the Organizer and not rectify immediately after Organizer's reminder and instruction will result in disqualification and remove all subsidies.
2. International teams invited by the Organizer will not receive additional subsidy if they have received hospitality from the Organizer. Foreign community teams may request the same subsidy as the local teams, but no additional meals or accommodation subsidy will be issued.
3. Each team shall cover its own transportation, meals, clothing, and other related expenses during the competition.
4. Teams shall obey the safety related instruction set out by the Organizer's training staff and lifeguards during practice and competitions. All team members must wear life vests (See instruction in Appendix 12) during competition and training/practice and must possess water safety knowledge and swimming ability. All teams shall take full responsibility for their own safety during pre-match training practice and competition.
5. Teams participate in pre-match training practice must sign up their training time accordingly and follow "Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships Pre-Match Training Practice & Safety Guidelines" (Appendix 10). The Pre-training schedule will be based on the order in which teams signed-up/registered for their training sessions.
6. In the event of a force majeure natural disaster, the organizer reserves the right to cancel or postpone the event. If the race has already commenced,

the participation subsidy will be issued as usual. The distribution or cancellation of prize money will be determined by the Organizers based on the progress of the competition.

7. If a team member or coach intentionally or negligently discards, drops, damages dragon boat related equipment, or capsizes or damages a dragon boat during the pre-match training or the competition which causes damage to the Organizer or a third party, he/she shall be liable for damages to the damages caused.
8. It is required that all teams and crew members follow the organizer staff, lifeguard and administrative officers' safety guideline and guidance during pre-match training or competition. If violation occurred and confirmed to be true, a warning notice is applied for the first offence. The violated team will be disqualified and the full subsidy will be cancelled for the second violation.
9. Should any team, team member or officials refuse to accept the Organizer's ruling, or any violation such as listed in XV-9. (11) and XV-9. (13) of the Rules and Regulations, disturb or disrupt the order of the event or act in unsportsmanlike manner or act in any other manner deemed as unsuitable by the Referee Committee, will be disqualified from the competition and all subsidies will be canceled. The Organizer may inform the relevant institution, organization, or school to ban the team or member(s) from next year's competition. The Organizer may formally request the team's affiliated government or school to impose disciplinary measures.
10. All staff members of the Organizer, organizer sponsored public steersperson, and referees are not allowed to participate as members or officials for any team.
11. The winner's prize money is regarded as an income. Therefore, must follow the Consolidated Income Tax rules of Taiwan accordingly. Government organizations and schools need to file the tax withholding for their teams. The tax withholding of private institutes or social communities will be filed through the assistance of organization commissioned by Department of Sports.
12. If The amount and recipients of the competition subsidy for each participating team meet the supplementary premium requirements of the second-generation National Health Insurance, the Department of Sports

will withhold and remit the supplementary insurance fee as required.

13. The Organizer purchases public accident liability insurance for participants according to the "Public Accident Liability Insurance Standard for Large and Group Events in Taipei City" (all details shall be subject to the insurance contract signed by the Organizer and the insurance company). It is advised to be cautious of your own safety and place additional personal accident insurance on your own. The insured items and amount are as follows. The terms and conditions are detailed in the policy:

(1) The liability for each bodily injury is NT\$3,000,000

(2) Liability for bodily injury in each accident: NT\$15,000,000

(3) Liability for loss of financial property in each accident is NT\$2,000,000

(4) The maximum coverage amount within the insurance period is NT\$34 million

14. The Organizer and its authorized vendors have the right to use, free of charge, recordings and photographs of participants related to this event for broadcast, exhibition, or publication on the event website worldwide. Participants shall have no civil claims against the Organizer and its authorized vendors for the use of their likenesses as mentioned above. If a third party, other than the Organizer and its authorized vendors, infringes upon the participants' portrait rights, the participants agree to assign the claims and rights to pursue legal action arising from such infringements to the event organizers and their authorized vendors. No further declaration of assignment from the participants is required.

15. **Teams may only place items at the competition venue on the day of the competition.** Items used to reserve space in advance will be treated as abandoned and collectively disposed of. Each tent is in principle for use of two teams.

16. Each team should prepare its own flag(s) and flagpole to represent the team in the race and official ceremonies.

XIX. Any further information or revision of the regulations will be adopted and announced by the Organizer as it occurs.


Specifications for Personal Life Jackets And Personal Floating Devices

I 、 Style :

1. Vest design ; Mainly in zipper or snap in (buckled). Buoyancy suits, belt-type/waist band type, inflatable, and pneumatic life jackets are **prohibited**.
2. No restriction on color or brand but needs to be in uniformed color for the whole team.
3. Clothes that doesn't belong to life jacket category (e.g. protective vest/impact vest, seaman coverall/ marine work vests, etc.) don't comply with the Organizer's regulations which are not allowed.

II 、 Material and Buoyancy :

1. Covered with 100% nylon and filled with high density soft rubber foam COREX foam N.B.R or PVC foam.
2. Personal Floating Devices need to meet European Standard (EN ISO 12402-5 EN 393 50N) or (ENISO 12402-4 EN 395 100N) ; or US Coast Guard approved (USCG) Type II, 15.5lbs, 70N or Type III 15.5lbs, 70N.



III 、 Any team that wishes to use personal life jackets needs to fill and turn in “2026 Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships Acknowledgement of Risk/Responsibility and Liability Waiver for Teams with Personal Life Jackets” at registration. It is Okay if later the team decides to use the Organizer provided life jacket.

Acknowledgement of Risk/Responsibility and Liability Waiver for Teams with Personal Life Jackets

I fully understand that it is a vigorous sports competition and aware of the potential risks of this event. The Organizer requires all participants to properly wear life jackets that meet safety standard during dragon boat practice and races before entering the water (the Organizer also provides uniform life jackets). However, due to various considerations, our team will use personal life jackets for practice and competition. The life jackets used by our team have complied with the relevant regulations on the styles and specifications on personal floating devices lay out in Appendix 3 of the Rules and Regulations. If the Organizer has any concerns regarding the personal life jackets and floating devices, I will unconditionally provide supporting information for the Organizer's reference (such as the life jacket inspection certificate or the relevant specification certificate issued by the life jacket manufacturer, etc.).

If, due to improper wearing of my own life jacket or circumvention of the Organizer random inspections may lead to injury or even death, I still insist on using my own life jacket under such circumstances. I agree to waive the Organizer and its representatives, staff, coaches, staff and other related personnel in all civil litigation and the right to claim compensation once an accident occurs. And declare that the above-mentioned exposing personnel shall not be responsible for any personal injury inflicted by myself or others, property loss and accident caused by the activities I participate in. I agree that once an accident occurs, I will be responsible for all injuries or losses. The interpretation and application of this statement, as well as disputes related to this statement, shall be handled in accordance with the laws of the Republic of China. The first instance jurisdiction shall be Taipei District Court of Taiwan.



The International Dragon Boat Federation Standard Racing Paddle Specification

The personal paddle must pass the specification inspection before they can be used in the competition.



Thickness of the blade: The thickness is at least 4mm measured 10mm from the bottom edge of the blade.

Note: There are standard paddles certified by the International Dragon Boat Federation IDBF (as shown in the picture). The paddles used for the Championships must be sent to the organizer for inspection. Even if the whole team uses the same type/model of paddles, they still all need to be brought to the "Paddle Inspection Area" for verification. After verification by the Organizer, the shaft of the paddle will be affixed with the Organizer approved label. Any personal paddle that fails to pass the verification CANNOT be used for the competition.

2026 Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships Pre-Match Training Practice & Safety Guidelines

1. The teams registered for the 2026 Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships may sign up for the practice/training session. Online sign up only (except for invitational teams). The closing of sign-up time is at 17:00 two days before the training day. (Please find the sign-up schedule on the event website.)
2. The pre-match training practice time: morning training sessions are scheduled in shifts from 6:00 - 11:00; The afternoon sessions are scheduled from 13:30 to 16:30. All teams must leave the water before 16:30.
3. The participants for training and competition must possess water safety knowledge and swimming ability. Before participating in pre-match training, one should conduct a personal physical exam and consider one's physical condition. The participants are responsible for monitoring his or her physical condition before and during the training session. Proper warm-up is required before training/practice and the competition to avoid sports injuries.
4. All teams can only practice in the area and water lanes specified by the Organizer, which extends 500-meter upstream (east) and 500-meter downstream (west) of Dazhi Bridge. The water way divides in the center line. Keep to the right downstream and keep to the left when returning.
5. During the training and the competition, each team is required to stay within the assigned lane and a life jacket should be worn at all times. Seat switching is prohibited to avoid accident. It is required to follow the instructions of Organizer's staff and guards. Any violations will result in a warning for the first offense and subsidy revoking and race suspension at the second offense.
6. Rowing equipment needed can be borrowed from the management unit of the Organizer with signing up prior to the practice. At least 7 pairs of paddles and a helm for 15 participants are needed for Standard Dragon Boat. And 4 pairs of paddles and a helm for 9 participants are needed for Small Dragon Boat.
7. The organizer will provide the dragon boats, paddles, drumsticks, helms, life jackets and any needed equipment without any fees. It is the team's responsibility to return the lent equipment properly after use. In the case of lost or damaged equipment, the team will be paying the full price.
8. Please take good care of all the lent equipment. Other than Force Majeure, any purposeful discarding or damaging of the equipment or capsizing the dragon boat will result in disqualification from the practice. The team will also need to pay the full price for the damages. Any violations of local laws and regulations will be subject to

investigation.

9. In case of a typhoon alert, heavy rain alert or any other natural disasters issued by the Central Weather Bureau prior to the training, please contact the Pre-Match Training Management Unit for updates on schedule change. If the waves get too high or a thunderstorm occurs during practice or the competition, please follow the instructions of the Organizer /Management Unit and leave the water immediately.
10. The organizer reserves the right to stop training session and the competition for the safety of personnel and the operation of the event. No objections from teams will be accepted.
11. Please make sure to bring a photo ID for checking in at scheduled training. For local residence, Personal Identification Card is required. For foreigners, the passport or ROC (Taiwan) Resident Certificate is required. The ID provided on site will be scanned for identification and online insurance. Anyone who fails to bring a photo ID is not allowed to participate in Pre-match practice.
12. Each team should have their own steersperson/coxswain during practice.
13. Any further information or revision will be announced by the Organizer as it occurs.

1. Time and Dates:

No drums nor drumsticks will be provided for the above-mentioned time slot. The Organizer may adopt or adjust the time and dates base on the weather condition, water condition, or any unexpected conditions.

2. Sign-up Procedure:

(1) Sign up: Online sign up only. Please sign up to reserve practice slots in the registration system (dragonboat.taipei).

(2) Open and Closing Time:

(a) Slots are open for sign-up in 2 batches. The latest sign-up time is at 5:00 PM two days before the training day.

(b) Sign-up system opens at 10:00 AM on April 22, 2026 (Wednesday) to sign up for practice slots between May 2, 2026 (Saturday) and May 22, 2026 (Friday). It will open again at 10:00 AM on May 13, 2026 (Wednesday) to sign up for practice slots between May 23, 2026 (Saturday) and June 14, 2026 (Sunday).

(c) There are five slots for the morning session. Each slot is one hour duration. (See the table below for slot hours)

(d) There are three slots for the afternoon session. Each slot is one hour duration. (See the chart below for slot hours)

(ii) Closed from noon of June 5, 2026 (Friday) and closed all day on June 6, 2026 (Saturday) for River Worshipping and Eye Dotting Ceremony.

(iii) Closed all day from June 15, 2026 (Monday) onward for site inspection and readiness for the Championships.

(3) Sing up is limited to two times daily (one in the morning and one in the afternoon).

3. Boarding conditions: Standard dragon boats require at least 7 pairs of paddles and 1 helm for a total of 15 people; small dragon boats require at least 4 pairs of paddles and 1 helm for a total of 9 people.

4. Others:

(1) Telephone sign-up and on-site sign-up are not accepted. Teams are required to complete their online reservation (sign-up) for practice slots or cancel them no later than 2 days before the practice date. Except for natural weather factors, if a team accumulates 2 missed practice sessions after making a reservation, the team's subsequent reserved practice slots will be cancelled to protect the rights of other teams and the effective use of resources. Teams with cancelled slot(s) can follow sign up procedure to sign up open slots.

(2) Please make sure to bring a photo ID when check in for training. For local residence, Personal Identification Card is required. For foreigners, the passport or ROC (Taiwan) Resident Certificate is required. The ID provided on site will be scanned for identification and online insurance. Everyone participated must follow all the rules set forth in the 2026 Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships Pre-Match Training Practice & Safety Guidelines. Anyone who fails to bring a photo ID will not be allowed to participate in practice.

(3) Pre-match training session is for teams and their crew members and coaches registered for 2026 Taipei International Dragon Boat Championships. It is not acceptable to change dragon boat sizes or merge teams.

(4) Management staff for pre-match training: To be announced

(5) Drumming will be prohibited during May and June for the tranquility needed for national and high school exam days, final exam days and to accommodate school requirements.

(6) If further rules and regulations needed in the future will be posted on site and on the event official website.

Donning Instruction- Step 1- Make sure to put on the vest with the front side up. The Logo is on the back side of the vest.

Rules and Regulations for Simulation Pool

Department of Sports, Taipei City Government

1. It is regulated and governed by Department of Sports, Taipei City Government based on article 3 of Taipei City Government Venue Management Act.
2. The pool is 90 cm deep.
3. No business conduct is allowed at the venue.
4. It is forbidden to transfer partial or the whole venue for other parties.
5. Please abide by the followings to maintain the safety, order, and cleanness of the venue:
 - (1) Appropriate sports attire and proper warm up are required before entering the venue. If you experience cramps during practice, you should stop activities immediately.
 - (2) In order to maintain tranquility, please comply with the noise control standards issued by the Environmental Protection Department of the Executive Yuan and prohibit all types of equipment for noise (such as loudspeakers, amplifiers, gas whistle, drums, etc.).
 - (3) Do not bring young children or animals into the facility for safety.
 - (4) Do not smoke, eat, chew gum or betel nut, spit, discard garbage or cigarette butts, set off firecrackers, drink alcohol, fight, gamble, cook, camp overnight or any illegal conduct.
 - (5) It is everyone's responsibility to maintain the public facilities together. The Organizer will seek compensation from whoever caused or contributed to damages if damages occur. It is strictly prohibited to run, push, or tag, or chase within the pool or around the pool. The party involved will be responsible for any accident occurred due to any of the above acts.
 - (6) Anyone who does not abide by these rules of use and has been advised by management will be asked to leave the venue.
 - (7) In case of thunder and lightning, please stop all activities immediately and follow the instructions of the administrator/staff.
 - (8) The Department does not take responsibility for safekeeping of personal valuables.
6. The Organizer provides public paddles for practice free of charge. Each team shall return the paddle(s) intact after using it. If the equipment is damaged or lost, the responsible team shall pay for it.
7. The Department reserves the right to amend the regulations as needed.

1. Time and Dates: Practice trainings open daily from 8:00 AM- 10:00 PM between May 2, 2026 (Saturday) and June 14, 2026 (Sunday).
2. Procedure for signing up:
 - (1) Sign-up system opens at 10:00 AM on April 22, 2026 (Wednesday) to sign up for practice slots between May 2, 2026 (Saturday) and May 22, 2026 (Friday). It will open again at 10:00 AM on May 13, 2026 (Wednesday) to sign up for practice slots between May 23, 2026 (Saturday) and June 14, 2026 (Sunday).
 - (2) Please complete your reservation by 5:00 pm at the latest 2 days before the practice day. No onsite registration (sign up) is available.
 - (3) Teams registered for this year's Championships may register for practice through the registration system on the event website (dragonboat.taipei).
 - (4) It is limited to one session (an hour) a day for each team.
 - (5) If a team is unable to attend the practice, it should cancel the reservation by itself. If a team is absent from reserved practice for 2 times, the rest of the reserved practice sessions for the team will be canceled to protect the rights of other teams and the effective use of resources.
